(3) SYLLABUS

In the course Art, Space Communication, the everyday environment is explored through concepts of space and artistic practices, leading to topics related to private and public space. This makes an opportunity for the development of artistic works that have a research character, using multiple media/mediums. The following relationship is also explored: work of art - creator - audience, with the simultaneous analysis of space and communication concepts that determine the construction and character of the work of art.

In this course, contemporary training practices are used with emphasis on participation, interaction and dialogue, with group work, lectures, presentations, discussions, and guest artists/speakers.
